### ***ENTSOG reminder: Only few days left for TYNDP 2017 project submission***

**(Brussels, 3 May 2016, PR0106-16) ENTSOG reminds project promoters that the submission of projects for the TYNDP 2017 closes on 8 May. Inclusion of projects in TYNDP 2017 is a prerequisite to be part of the third PCI selection process.**

The “Project Submission Phase” of the Ten-Year-Network-Development-Plan (TYNDP) 2017 closes on **8 May 2016**. This time slot is the only opportunity for projects to become part of the TYNDP 2017. It allows the submission of new projects. But also projects already submitted for the TYNDP 2015 have to be confirmed and updated to be considered in the TYNDP 2017.

All project data is collected exclusively through the [ENTSOG Project Data Portal](#). The ENTSOG Documentation Kit, the manual for the Project Data Portal and Project Data Submission Process, is available on the ENTSOG website at [this link](#).
