ENTSOG publishes draft TYNDP 2018 Project-Specific CBA (PS-CBA) fiches

(Brussels, 8 April 2019, PR0180-19) Today, ENTSOG publishes for the first time the project-specific CBA results (fiches) as a section of the draft Ten Year Network Development Plan (TYNDP) 2018.

Project-specific assessment has been performed for the first time following the approved 2nd CBA Methodology (available [here](#)) as part of the TYNDP 2018 process, as this allows for:

- The assessment of projects on a comparable basis;
- Consistent results to be provided to promoters;
- Increased transparency for stakeholders on the projects' assessment.

On that basis, results are also for the first time published in the TYNDP in the form of a "Project Fiche". This follows the publication of the TYNDP 2018 System Assessment Report ([here](#)) which identifies potential investment needs in the European gas system. The Report also outlines how projects submitted to TYNDP 2018, and aggregated in infrastructure levels, can help mitigate these needs.

The publication of the PS-CBA fiches allows the provision of technical support to promoters, while also ensuring a level-playing field and a transparent assessment for all stakeholders. Presenting the cost-benefit analysis of projects using a standardised template ensures the provision of relevant project information and PS-CBA results in a harmonised, concise and comparable manner.
