

ENTSOG publishes its second Tariff Network Code (TAR NC) monitoring report

(Brussels, 22 April, PR0204-20) **Today, ENTSOG published the Tariff Network Code (TAR NC) report of Implementation and Effect Monitoring by European TSOs for 2019, the second report since the TAR NC entered into force on 6 April 2017.**

The TAR NC contributes to achieving tariffs, or methodologies used to calculate them, which are transparent, non-discriminatory, take into account the need for system integrity and its improvement, reflect the actual costs incurred, facilitate efficient gas trade and competition, avoid cross-subsidies between network users, and provide incentives for investment.

The TAR NC monitoring report was developed by ENTSOG to show the effects and status of implementation of the TAR NC by European TSOs at the reference date of **1 October 2019**. It is the first report covering elements from the last application date of 31 May 2019. Information was collected by ENTSOG from European TSOs by questionnaires. The received information is analysed in this report and conclusions are drawn.

The report consists of two parts: Implementation monitoring and Effect monitoring, which echoes the requirements of Article 8(8) of the Gas Regulation. The Implementation monitoring section assesses the level of implementation of the provisions in the TAR NC. In the Effect monitoring section, the effect of the TAR NC across the European gas market is assessed by means of five indicators: ratio of revenue under-/over-recovery, changes in average tariff levels, seasonal factors for Interconnection Points (IPs), publication of information in English and multipliers for short-term products.
