### ***ENTSOG publishes the project groups of Project-Specific Cost-Benefit Analysis for TYNDP 2020***

(Brussels, 11 May, PR0207-20) **Today, ENTSOG publishes the project groups of Project-Specific Cost-Benefit Analysis (PS-CBA groups) as part of the Ten-Year Network Development Plan 2020 (TYNDP 2020). PS-CBA is performed as part of the TYNDP process and PS-CBA groups are the basis for the project-specific assessment.**

ENTSOG performs PS-CBA as part of the TYNDP process to support the selection of Projects of Common Interest (PCI), in accordance with Regulation (EU) 347/2013. In this context, PS-CBA groups were also discussed within the PCI Cooperation Platform, which is composed of ENTSOG, European Commission and ACER, prior to publication. The PS-CBA groups include only those projects, whose promoters expressed their intention to apply for the next (5th) PCI round during the TYNDP 2020 project collection process. Assessment of projects within the PCI process is undertaken by the European Commission.

The PS-CBA grouping is based on the principles described in section 3.1 of the “**2<sup>nd</sup> ENTSOG methodology for cost-benefit analysis of gas infrastructure projects**” available [here](#).

Some projects, whose promoters indicated intention to apply for the PCI status, will not be modelled under PS-CBA, for a number of reasons. These projects have not been included in the PS-CBA groups but are available in the spreadsheet “Not-modelled projects” together with the reason for non-modelling.

The results of PS-CBA modelling will be published in the draft TYNDP 2020 and will provide technical support to project promoters and ensure an unbiased and transparent assessment towards all stakeholders.
