ENTSOG publishes Implementation Monitoring Reports

(Brussels, 8 June, PR109-16) ENTSOG is monitoring the implementation of the CMP Guidelines, the BAL Network Code and the CAM Network Codes. The new reports are now ready and available. All of them will be sent to ACER and have been published on the ENTSOG web site.

CMP Guidelines

Most ENTSOG members have already fully implemented the CMP Guidelines. Only a few members are still in the process of implementing some of the congestion management mechanisms. From the current perspective, all TSOs are expected to become compliant during 2016.

CAM Network Code

The vast majority of TSOs have implemented all of the mandatory requirements from CAM NC on time, thus providing strong support for the integrated EU gas market. A high number of TSOs have reported that they will implement the as yet unapplied CAM NC Articles by the end of 2016 or at the beginning of 2017.

BAL Network Code

The Monitoring Report on the Implementation of the Balancing Network Code is the first report since the Code entered into force on 1 October 2015. The Balancing Network Code allows some flexibility on national level. It indicates that some countries have already implemented the Balancing Network Code (BAL NC) provisions while the majority of countries must still undertake larger or smaller steps in order to implement the regulation.

Jan Ingwersen, ENTSOG General Manager, said, *“The early implementation initiatives of CAM and BAL Network Codes have been important for TSOs in delivering contributions to the internal gas market, and we are seeing the impacts on the market functioning already.”*
